



East is going to play 5 . You were the declarer. Have fun?


Firstly it depends on the lead. Say, South leads A ♥, how will you play?


You ruff the lead. Then, you might play A ♠, K ♠, and then a small one, that would get ruffed by South's 9♠. South knows you are ruffing your spades. He plays his remaining ♠ (A♠), but this does not hurt you. You will be able to ruff ♠ two more times, making 5.

Terrible experience occurs if South leads A♣ and then 9♣, leaving your dummy only one card of ♣. Now you can ruff ♠ for only one time. Two possible losers in spades if opponents hold 5-2.

If I tell you opponent really gets 5-2 ♠, you are giving up?

You will regret if you give up too soon. One of the lines to make the contract is that you lose a ♠ trick in advance for an endplay. The one who holds 5 cards ♠ gets KQ ♦ will get squeezed. See below,



No matter what the lead is, how would the declarer is going to be?

Ruffing diamonds in dummy seems to be the correct play, though the declarers in these two teams were thinking in another ways.

In open room, Baron Ng, being the declarer, facing the K lead, won A and then he knew that only QJ were better then his diamonds. He decided to pull trumps directly and claim three losers namely one heart and QJ ↓ 4 just made.

He needed 3-2 trump break for his play. Certainly it was 3-2, no surprise. Lucky man.

In close room, Li, being the declarer, saw the lead of a heart. He played A → and then 8 →. The defender played another round of heart to declarer's A →. The declarer could now try to ruff a diamond, but he played two rounds of → before doing it.

After ruffing a diamond, he tried to get back to hand by playing ♣, but now North had no ♣. North played a trump. The declarer could over-ruff ♣ for another diamond ruff but he decided to loser-on-loser with his ▶. North then played ▶, which was somewhat ruffed by South's 10 ♠! The declarer was too busy to count the number of trumps played. Finally he pulled a useless round of trump to dummy. The dummy's 8▶ was the 4th loser for -13 imps.

South led A♠, and then shift to 9♠.

The declarer won by Q. She then pulled trumps, ended in hand. A. then KQ discarded two clubs. Next, she played her remaining hearts, ended in dummy. At the end of her declarer play, she finessed spade one more time. A. discarded a losing club to make the contract. 11 imps to the slam maker as another side landed in 4 level.

Even if South did not lead A♠, the declarer needed the success of spade finesse to make the slam, so she would do the finesse at the beginning. The diamond loser would still be discarded by A♠. All she lost was the K♣.

The declarer play was not that interesting.

But you might have been surprised after seeing the bidding auction. East was supposed to pass 4 no matter what she had. Calm down! This hand is recorded in vugraph. Perhaps, West's 3 4 bid had been alerted on the table, which did tell partner slam try? (I don't think so)

2008 年北美夏季桥牌大赛(二)

北京时间今天下午, Spingold 杯 16 强全部产生,没有什么太大的冷门出现。最 强的种子落败是 11 号 Milner 队, 另外就 要数 16 号种子 Mahaffey 输给 17 号种子 Brogeland 队了。福中/赵杰近来在北美的 成绩不是很好, 这次他们没能过得了这个杂 牌队的关。相比之下,施豪军/庄则军所在 的队败给 8 号种子 Meltzer 队算不上什么 新闻,因为毕竟对手全部是世界冠军,而且 还有目前炙手可热的 Helgemo/Helness 组合。BBO 转播了 Mahaffey 队与 Brogeland 队之间的第 1 节比赛, 施豪军 队与 Meltzer 队之间的第 3 节比赛,也是 Meltzer 奠定胜局的一节,令中国观众失望 的是, 福中/赵杰和施豪军/庄则军都没有上 场。无论怎么样,他们的队友发挥和运气都 欠佳。

双方第1节,老板照惯例上场,施豪军 队取得领先,但第2节就被追平,第3节 拉大了差距,第4节没有反扑成功。第3 节的比赛,加拿大人错误地冲上2副满贯, 并且在下面这副牌上选择定约错误。

两桌前面叫牌过程都一样, 区别在最后 的一锤定音。东家开叫 1◆, 南家阻击 2♥, 西 2▲逼叫, 然后北家都是凭借良好局况跳 至 5♥给对手施压, 东家的 Pass 肯定是逼 叫的,在开室,施/庄的队友、加拿大人 Wolpert 简单地跳叫 6♠。6♠定约看上去 不错,但◆4-1特别是◆的5-0分布导致 定约缺乏成功的因素。首攻♥, A 吃住, 2 轮将牌到明手,发现将牌的分布后用*回 手,但被北家将吃,再兑现♥定约宕一。

闭室最后一叫显示了世界冠军的叫牌 默契。同样是逼叫 Pass 过来后, Helgemo 没有选择•满贯, 而是叫 5NT 让同伴挑选, 同伴在显示过《有些许配合之后再叫》应该 是5张, Helgemo 毫不犹豫地同意这一定 约。打牌很容易,首攻也是♥,明手A停住, 飞一个◆, 打将牌到明手大牌, 发现 5-0 分布, 再飞◆, 成功后打小◆让明手将吃, 无论南家如何防守, Helness 给他看牌了。 有意思的是,首攻♥后即使明手不上A而放 小,定约也能成功,当然是双明手的前提下。 南家拿到第一墩后最好出●, 庄家取到然后 打量明手用 8 飞(南家顶上就管住他), 兑 现♥A, 飞◆回手再飞♣, 第二轮◆到手上, 打光所有将牌,北家允许垫掉3张♥和1张 ▲, 在最后 1 张将牌上, 北家如果垫◆, 庄 家◆全好,如果垫◆,则明手可以超打而使 得◆全部成为赢墩。

Sunny worked out that partner held long clubs and the diamond lead offered the best chance. East could not double for lead, as it would push NS to 7N (everyone gets the simple automatic squeeze right).


