MINUTES OF THE 7th COUNCIL MEETING FOR 2000

Date & Time : 18 September 2000 at 6:30 p.m.

ACTION

1. Minutes of the Last Meeting was read and adopted.
2. Matters arising from minutes of the last meeting
 - a. RZ will analyze recent years attendance and prepare a report on how to increase attendance and create revenue. RZ
 - b. BK suggested that there should be a review of the master-point formula to raise incentives for some players to participate, LL would review the system. LL
 - c. SB would follow up the price of repairing the wooden screen. SB
 - d. Regarding the sponsorship of tournaments held by the Inter Post-Secondary Union of Bridge, AL suggested that a budget should be handed in beforehand, so that the council could have a clearer idea of their financial situation. AL also suggested that the Youth Development Committee should balanced the budget when giving out sponsorship.
3. Progress
 - a. 11th World Bridge Olympiad in Maastricht.
 The captain's reports for Open, Ladies and Youth Teams were received and adopted. The Council acknowledged the hard work of Mr. Henry Lam for being the captain for all three teams. The Council would appreciate if further suggestions and recommendations were added in the report for the reference of next year's teams.
 AC pointed out that during the tournament, there was an appeal cast of the Ladies Team due to improper filling in the convention card. The Council agreed that the convention card should be submitted for Council approval beforehand, and until they are amended to meet the minimum standard, the team should not be allowed to participate in the tournament Concerned.
 - b. Financial situation, membership and tournament attendance
 As many directors have not reported to AL about the tournaments' balance, no updated report was available.
 It was agreed that directors should email the registration form and the balance sheet of the tournament to AL, deposit the surplus to

- c. Update status on club premises
 AC had a meeting with Mr. Timothy Fok. Mr. Fok showed support for promoting Bridge, and promised to discuss the premise matter in the coming meeting. Mr. Patrick Choy would make arrangement with the allocation of premises. AC would follow up with this matter. AC
 - d. Update status on youth/student development and subsidy
 LL reported his proposal for youth development. LL
 Regarding the register matter, it was agreed that players could register both for teams and for pairs. If there were 3 or more teams, team trial would be held for those registered as for teams, else pairs trial would be held for players registered for pairs.
 It was agreed that the coach would be granted full authority to train the players.
 LL would prepare a document for the qualified team members to sign, so as to ensure they acknowledge the conditions.
 BK added that if there were only 1 team registered, it would be subject to council approval for its qualification.
 AC added that screens should be used throughout the trial.
 - e. Update on status with SF&OC
 SB attended some functions held by SF&OC, such as a press conference for the Asian Games and the recent council meeting of the SF&OC. SB suggested that it was necessary to know more about the internal operations in SF&OC before we could seek for more support. SB
 SB would follow up on this matter.
 SB would also investigate the possibility to seek for venue for tournaments in the Stadium.
 SB would also investigate the possibility of holding the Open Pairs and Open Team with the LCSD.
4. 50th Anniversary Inter-city
 AC reported that the tentative organizing committee would be: AC, the Honorary Treasurer, KC, Nancy Neumann and Ringo Lee.
 AC predicted that there would be around 48 visiting teams for next year's Inter-city, therefore, there may be a reduction in the number of local teams due to insufficient space. It was agreed that it would be of first priority to serve the visiting teams, and AC would try his best to find a bigger space to entertain more local teams.
 AC would contact Mrs. Nelly Fong to arrange for the celebrity in next year's Inter-city.
 5. 2005 Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup
 AC reported that the HKTA supported HKCBA to hold the 2005 Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup in Hong Kong. Patrick Choy expressed our intention in the meeting in Maastricht, and received positive response. AC

AC predicted that \$3,000,000, excluding venue fee, would be required for organizing this tournament. AC would try to make the fee we need to give to WBF for hosting the event as low as possible, say around US\$150,000.

As for the venue, AC suggested the Convention and Exhibition Center, and he would follow up with the HKTA.

In order to boost sponsorships, AC proposed to invite important officials in the People's Republic of China to the opening ceremony. AC reported that the Chinese Bridge Association would fully support us if we hold the event. AC would follow up on this matter.

6. **40th PABF Championships in Singapore**

SB reported the tentative Conditions of Contest for the PABF trials. BK suggested that the training schedule of the qualified teams should be more flexible, making it 80 boards practice per month on average. SB insisted that there must be 6 players in a team before they can register for the trial. SB would modify the Conditions of Contest, RZ would proofread it.

SB/RZ

AC reported that there would be only 2 berths for this region, as host country, Indonesia, would automatically be one of the three berths.

7. **Shanghai/Hong Kong Interport**

It would be held on 25-26/11. It was agreed that Nancy Neumann would determine the players for the Women Team, Terence Tung would determine the players for the Open Team.

8. **Matter of Wallis Leung**

BK reported that Wallis Leung sent a reply letter to HKCBA. He apologized for his misbehavior during the Inter-City. This is not acceptable to the Council. Wallis Leung's qualification as a tournament director will be revoked with immediate effect. BK will send a letter to Wallis Leung, advising him that his membership will be indefinitely suspended until he formally apologizes to both Mr. Nelson Hsi and the tournament directors, to the Council's satisfaction.

9. **A.O.B.**

a. SB suggested that there should be a more concrete rule for accessing penalties to players using mobile phones during the tournaments. The council clarified that the primary reason for disallowing the use of mobile phones was that it caused disturbance to other players, rather than the suspicion that players may exchange signals or cheat by mobile phones.

It was agreed that there would be a penalty of 10% of the top of a board if the mobile phone rings and the player did not answer it. If the director saw the player answer the phone, 50% of the top of a board would be deducted. Directors should make announcement about this before the start of the tournament.

b. SB suggested that there should be penalty for those who filled in the curtain cards improperly and those who did not put the curtain card back to the board after play. It was agreed that a penalty of 10% of

the top of a board would be accessed for the above offense. Directors should make announcement about this before the start of the tournament.

c. LL would make online announcement about the mobile phone and curtain card policies.

d. AC proposed organizing another Director Training Course. BT suggested that one should at least be 'Master' to qualify as director. For the existing directors, they should be 'Master' within 2 years, or their qualification risks suspension.

e. SB reported that 20 participants agreed to participate in the Grand Slam Individual Championship, while 4 rejected the offer. It was agreed that no more players would be invited to fill the vacancy, and only 19 boards would be played.

f. There would be a bridge competition held in Nanling on 2-7/11. CY would post the details at Bridgzone, and LL would post the details online. CY/LL

g. Regarding the confusion caused when typhoon comes, it was agreed that SB would make the final decision on whether the tournament would be cancelled.

h. AL suggested a tender for the watch donated for Inter-city as sponsorship. It was agreed that AL would draft an article describing the watch for RZ to proofread. AL/RZ

The bottom price for the watch was \$12,000. CY and LL would make announcement and post the photo of the watch at Bridgzone and online. LL would check the email for the bid for the watch, and he would post the updated bid online weekly. CY/LL

i. BT suggested that it was hard for players to notice any new announcement online. LL would modify the homepage. LL

j. SK raised the issue on appointing a Memorial Cup in Mr. Tom Wong's name. It was agreed that the tournament should be an open tournament, named 'Tom Wong Memorial Cup Swiss Pairs'. In order to promote youth development, all youth players could get double master point in this tournament. SB would draft the Condition of Contest of this event by next month. SB

10. **Date & place of next meeting**

The date of next meeting would be on 18th October 2000 and it would be held at Queen's College Old Boys Association.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 21:00.

1. Minutes of the Last Meeting was read and adopted.
2. Matters arising from minutes of the last meeting
 - a. RZ would analyze recent years' attendance and prepare the report on how to increase attendance and generate higher revenue. RZ
 - b. LL invited BK, Mr. WK Lai and Mr. Johnson Fok to review the master-point formula.
 - c. Due to absence of SB, the price of repairing the wooden screen will be reported next time. SB
 - d. SB would follow up on the status with SF&OC. SB
 - e. AC obtained the quotation for holding the 2005 Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup, but nothing can be done at this stage. AC would continue to follow up. AC
 - f. BK would send a letter to Mr. Wallis Leung, advising him that his membership will be indefinitely suspended until he formally apologizes to both Mr. Nelson Hsi and the tournament directors, to the Council's satisfaction. BK
 - g. LL would make online announcement about the mobile phone and curtain card policies. LL
 - h. The date of the bridge competition in Nanling has changed from 2-7/11 to 14-19/11.
 - i. AL would send the document about the watch to LL to post on the web. AL
3. Progress
 - a. PABF Trials
 For the Open section, there were 6 teams participating in the trials. LL/SB
 The first round robin was finished and the second round robin will be on 4, 5/11. The finals of the trials had to be arranged so that it would not be the same dates as China Cup and Hongkong Shanghai Interport.
 For the Youth section, there were 6 teams registered. LL suggested the venue to be in the University of Science and Technology, so that rental cost could be reduced. The dates of the trials had to be

arranged so that it would not be the same dates as the Director Training course and the trials for the Open section. LL would discuss with SB to determine the final condition of contests.

For the Ladies section, there was 1 team registered. However, only 4 players: Amy Yeung, Flora Wong, LL Lee and Monica Chan, registered for that team.

- b. Financial situation, membership and tournament attendance
 As there were still some directors who submit the registration forms late, AL could not update the financial situation. According to available information, attendance had dropped.
 There were 222 non-life members, including student members.
 KC would remind directors to send the registration forms to AL on time. KC
 - c. Update status on club premises
 AL reported the meeting with Mr. Leung Sai-wah, Paul, the Director of Leisure and Cultural Services. We aimed to secure a permanent venue for our regular tournaments, and to gain the support of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD). However, Mr. Leung did not show a positive response. He expressed that it was difficult to find a venue for our regular tournaments. Instead, he suggested that LCSD could sponsor some of our big events, like the Urban Council Cup few years before. AC would draft a proposal to submit to LCSD. AC
 - d. Update status on youth/student development and subsidy
 AC reported that there was a consultancy study of sports venue provided by the government by the Home Affairs Bureau. AC would approach Paul Leung to learn more details, and contact Mr. Vincent Fung to gain more information about the Home Affairs Bureau. AC
 - e. Update on status with SF&OC
 There was no obvious progress on this issue.
 - f. 50th Anniversary Inter-city
 AC reported that Mr. Ringo Lee was negotiating with several hotels for the quotation.
 AC would follow up on the celebrity contest co-organized with Lifeline Express. AC
 - g. 2005 Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup
 AC obtained the quotation. AC would follow up to see further situation in China Cup. AL suggested that if we were to organize this event, we had to make sure we had sufficient sponsorship. AC
4. **HKCBA TD Classification**
 AC emphasized that the aim for classifying tournament directors was to make sure that a current TD must be active. As the 1997 Laws has changed significantly, classification should be based on the TD's familiarity with the

1997 Laws. If TDs were not familiar with the 1997 Laws, they could attend Director Course to refresh their knowledge.

There would be 4 classes: international, NBO/zonal, senior and junior level. International level referred to WBF level, which had to obtain WBF recognition and supported by the zone. TDs would be promoted automatically if they reached the specific standards.

AL suggested that there should be a renewal period every few years. Current TDs had to re-apply to confirm their status.

DC suggested that the structure of the Board of Tournament Directors should be listed clearly to avoid confusion.

5. Shanghai/Hong Kong Interport

Players for the Open Team were: Samuel Wan, Derek Zen, Terence Tung and Peter Poon. Players for the Ladies Team were: Nancy Neumann, Shirley Chang and Shirley Leong, the 4th player had not been confirmed.

6. Matter of Wallis Leung

RZ had drafted the letter, BK would send the letter to Wallis Leung.

7. A.O.B

a. The extra \$5000 the Council gave to Mr. Henry Lam several years ago had been collected back.

b. 'Hong Kong Economic Times' wanted to have a column about the comparison between online bridge and play bridge in real life in its Internet Magazine. It asked HKCBA to refer a person for its consultancy. It was decided that RZ would attend the interview with HKET.

c. Chris Chung complained that it was unreasonable to charge director fee for the recent re-match of Open League, since it was due to the re-scheduling of HKCBA. It was agreed that director fee should not be charged for this time. LL suggested that we should try to fix the schedule as soon as possible, not until one or two weeks before any change. AC would reply to Chris Chung.

d. In view of the increased walk-over situations this year, AL called attention to the fact that the intention of Open League was to provide a chance to train players to play long match events. AL suggested that we should emphasize this intention to players wishing to play in Open League next year. SB would arrange next year's schedule to handle the increased walk-overs.

DC suggested publishing an article in Bridgzette about Open League to remind people about its original intention. CY would write the article.

e. LCSD sent us a letter, requesting us to fill in a form for the sports subsidy scheme before 31/10. The form included a forecast of expenditure in local and international events, local competitions and promotion scheme or training courses. AC would fax the form to BT, AL and SB, then AC would collect the form from them, consolidate

f. The minutes of the WBF Congress meeting was received, with the NCBOs recognized listed. The Re-zoning matter was postponed.

g. Council members were reminded that they would have to revise the handbook before the end of the year.

h. SF&OC requested us to send a letter of our rules of eligibility for representation. AC had sent the reply.

i. E-bridge wished to cooperate with us to promote its homepage. LL LL would follow up on this.

- a. RZ would analysis recent years' attendance and prepare the report on how to increase attendance and generate higher venue. RZ
- b. SB would provide the quotation for repairing the wooden screen. SB

SB suggested the format of Open League be reviewed so that possibilities of re-match would be reduced.
- i. CY would write the article about Open League. CY
- j. AC has completed and faxed the form for the sports subsidy scheme back to LCSD.
- k. LL contacted E-bridge and sent the contact list of Council members to them. E-bridge responded by asking us to promote their website to our members.

3. **Progress**

- a. **PABF Trials**
The qualifying sessions for the Open section have ended. Henry Lam is the team captain for Derek Zen's team, and Stephen Kwok for SK Luk's team.
For the Youth section, SB reported that it would use screen if Mariners' can lend us the tables. SB also suggested that the existing screens are not good enough, as it is possible for people to see his partner opposite the screen. There will be making of new screens designed by AC. SB would arrange AC to contact with the contractor to quote the price. SB

- b. **Financial situation, membership and tournament attendance**
Due to absence of AL, it was not discussed.
- c. **Update status on club premises**
AC has replied to the consultancy study of sports venue provided by the Home Affairs Bureau, requesting for a permanent venue of around 300m² for regular tournaments, so that more interest could be generated on this sports.
- d. **Update on status with student/youth development**
Youth trial would start on 18/11. The qualifying sessions would be a double round robin with a final. Though it was suggested that it should be a triple round robin next year. After the qualifying sessions, there would be a final determining team A and team B. Coach would be elected next meeting. DC suggested more power should be given to the coach during youth training, as it would be the coach, not the council, who know the details.
- e. **Update on status with SF&OC**
SB reported that during the meetings of SF&OC, other clubs would report on their clubs' activities. SB suggested that we should also prepare a report on our activities to show more participation in the

meeting. SB would take the sample of others' reports. LL and SB would prepare the report. LL/SB

SB reported that SF&OC would take the results of international tournaments as criteria for sponsorship.

SB suggested that it would be more convenient for him to serve next year's council as he has started to know more about the operations of SF&OC. He also suggested that we should find one more person to sit the meetings of SF&OC next year.

SB reported that there was selling of HKSAR Regional flag. It was determined that we would purchase one sized 96cm x 64cm.

SB reported that there would be an annual dinner at Convention Center held by SF&OC. He suggested all council members should attend this dinner to show our support to SF&OC. It was agreed that all council members would attend this dinner.

- e. **50th Anniversary Inter-City**
There was no obvious progress, as the venue was still not fixed.
- f. **Shanghai/Hong Kong Interport**
AC would send invoice to SCMP for next year's sponsorship. AC

4. **Matter about Sherman Ng's letter**

Sherman Ng sent a letter to the council, suggesting that players in HK were not familiar with the use of stop-card, and many of them would unintentionally transfer a lot of unauthorized information, as by undue hesitation and improper tempo. He suggested that the council could educate the players about the proper procedures and tempo. SB suggested that we could post an article telling players what should be done in Bridgette. BT suggested that LL could post that article in our homepage also. KC would draft the article. KC

1. Minutes of the Last Meeting was read and adopted.
2. Matters arising from minutes of the last meeting
 - a. AC would continue to follow up about the holding of the 2005 Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup. AC
 - b. AL would follow up with the selling of the watch. AL
 - c. CY would write the article about Open League. CY
 - d. SB and AC would follow up with the price of making new screens. SB/AC
 - e. KC would draft the article about proper tempo and procedures in playing bridge. KC
 - f. Concerning the present GP and MP system, some players suggested that it was faster to obtain GP then MP. It was suggested that formula for GP should take table factor into consideration. Besides, as GP and MP are intended to increase the incentives of players, MP depreciation could be considered when revising the formula. It was suggested that formula in handbook was not clear, when revising the formula, a clearer presentation method should be adopted. SB also suggested Open Mixed Pairs should not be a GP event. LL would circulate the revised formula for GP and MP before next meeting. LL
3. Progress
 - a. PABF Trials
 Both Open and Youth PABF trials were finished. The qualified Open team players are Derek Zen, Peter Yeung, Samuel Wan, Alan Sze, Thomas Ng, KL Choy. The qualified Youth team team A players are WK Lai, Yau Ngai, Aresene Yiu, Alice Ng, LH Chin, YC Lai, and the team B players are Kam Leung, YH Ng, Barry Chan, Tony Lau, Chris Fung, Victor Tsao. SB would give the hotel booking form for the PABF to the Non-Playing Captain of Ladies' Team and the captains of the qualified teams. The respective NPCs and captain would be responsible for the hotel booking. SB

- Team entries and photos of team players should be mailed to PABF before 20 March 2001; and system notes should be received by 31 March 2001, or there would be a penalty of US\$20 per day per pair. System notes should be received by all other teams before 10 April 2001, by mailing to the respective NCBOs. AC
- b. Financial situation, membership and tournament attendance
 There were 128 ordinary members, and no change in the number of life members. Attendance in general was around 7 to 9 tables.
 - c. Update status on club premises
 It would be difficult to obtain venue from the LCSD, after the meeting with them. BT suggested finding out the regulations for government resource allocation. It was reported that they were mainly based on international performance.
 - d. Update on status with student/youth development
 AC would send reports to the sponsors. AC
 There was a change in the age limit in WBF during the youth trial. As the trail was in progress, we could not change our rules and regulations. SB asked if it was possible for the youth team to substitute a player who was originally not eligible, but now became eligible under the change of the WBF policy. It was decided that we would discuss that issue if there was really such a request.
 - e. Update on status with SF&OC
 SB reported that there were two committees under SF&OC: Leisure and Culture Service Department (LCSD) and sports Promotion Department (SPD). SPD would emphasize more on quality of performance, while LCSD would focus at getting money from LCSD. Instead, we could ask LCSD for resources to organize bridge promoting activities like Urban Council Open Paris and some beginning courses. SB would try to confirm the places for the courses. As there was not enough people who know how to be bridge teachers. LL, BK, and SB would set up a committee to for the bridge courses. LL/BK/SB
4. AGM Preparation
 The date of AGM was confirmed to be 27 February 2001. BT/AL
 BT and AL would prepare audited account.
 KC would arrange for the prizes. KC
 AC Would call Mr. Raymond Chow to arrange for the guest to present prizes. The Chairman's report would be prepared for next meeting. AC
 AC would circulate the special voting members list before next meeting, LL would like check who is not member and remove them from the list; additional special voting members would be reviewed at next meeting if any. AC/LL
 5. Schedule 2001

The changes suggested were as follows.

- a. There would be no anchor players system in 2001. Ladder Team would permit 6 players, and Open league would permit 8 players per team.
 - b. For all year-round pairs event, it remained that best 7 ranking point out of 10 would be used to determine the winner. To encourage participation in the last 2 sessions and to increase the excitement of competing for the overall final ranking, the ranking points for these 2 sessions would be multiply by 1.5.
 - c. Ladderette team would be replaced by a multiple team event. Ranking point for last 3 sessions would be multiple be 1.5 Players attending all the sessions could get a refund, just like our practice in the Special Pairs in 2000.
 - d. For Ladder Team, 3 teams from section A would be demoted to section B instead of 2. The 1st placed team in each ladder and the better 2nd placed team shall be promoted to Ladder A.
 - e. For Paul Jones, RZ suggested to use IMP scoring producing one winning. Ranking point will be equal to the acquired total IMPs divided by the number of comparison and divided by the number of boards. The ranking point of the best 7 out of 10 sessions will determine the winner.
 - f. SB would circulate the revised format. SB
6. **Intercity** AC
 Quotation from Hotel Miramar was abstained. AC would follow up on this.
7. **David CC Ng's Letter about Life Master Pairs** AC
 SB would like to apologize for his misinformation provided. AC would reply the letter. AC

請欣賞 Long Match 的樂趣 The Joy of Long Match

橋牌會讓我寫一篇文章，希望有更多的隊參加明年舉行的聯賽 (League)。香港聯賽，據說始於1989年，當年由董先生提出設想，由 Patrick Choy 捐出獎盃，定名為 Ambassador Cup 目的是讓香港隊員有更多的 Long Match 練習。因為對香港來講，世界最高級的隊際賽百慕大盃，威尼斯杯，奧林匹克隊際賽，甚至遠東賽都是 Long Match。我本人是喜歡參加隊式比賽，當然更樂意參加 League 比賽。因為我認為這是表示一個隊的真實水平，而且運氣成份已降到最低。

我這裡介紹一些牌局，一方面希望讀者能欣賞某些牌局的精彩做莊(或防守)，有些牌局如果不是打隊式賽，未必會這樣主打(或防守)。—除註明外，都是選自2000年在荷蘭舉行的奧林匹克橋牌賽。

The HKCBA asked me to write an article to encourage more teams to participate in the coming 2001 League. It started in 1989, designed by Terence Tung and the winners' Cup donated by Patrick Choy known as The Ambassador Cup, format, long matches in a year long stretch. As we all know, important tournaments such as World Championships, Olympiad, Pacific-Asia Bridge Federation all had long matches to decide the winners.

I have selected some hands, save one, from the 2000 Olympiad for your enjoyment, note that some brilliant plays or defence might differ if put in another made, say, rubber or pairs.

I like long matches myself, League being one of my favorites, I consider it can truly reflect the team's level having minimized the luck factor.

I think that was good, enjoyable bridge, like a child snatching a bonbon from nowhere:

Well, that was the luck factor in bridge, but in a long match, luck could even out.
