
# Guangzhou Pearl River v Nanguang Power - Open Round 6

We start day two with a match between two heavyweight teams from China, Guangzhou Pearl River and Nanguang Power. Most of the Nanguang players were in the team which won the 2016 HK Intercity Championship and it would be no surprise were they to successfully defend their title, or indeed if Guangzhou proved to be the successful team this year. As if to back that up, going into their Round 6 match Guangzhou headed Group C while Nanguang lay second.

Board 21 was an easy 3NT for E/W but there was much more scope for a swing on the second deal of the day.



For Nanguang, Jianfeng Peng opened what looks like a book example of a vulnerable 3♣ pre-empt and S. N. Wong doubled for take-out. W.K. Chan duly bid his hearts and when that came round to Jiaxian Shen he doubled, ending the auction. Peng led the king of clubs and dummy's ace was ruffed out. Shen found the best defence of a low spade return, Peng winning the king and cashing two club winners. Next he switched to the ten of diamonds so Shen won the queen and ace before playing a low spade. Chan ruffed and led a heart to the ace but there was still the ♥K to be lost so he was down three for −500.

For Guangzhou, Yongchuan Li did not open the East hand whether this was a systemic matter or simply his judgment, I cannot say. Rui Wang opened the South hand with a strong club and Hongbin Song overcalled 14, natural. Lin now bid and rebid the clubs and, when 3♣ reached Shenghon Chen he made a very dangerous balancing bid of 3% – dangerous because his opponents had not found a fit, so there was no guarantee that his side would have one either. As it turned out, Chen got lucky in that not only did his partner have excellent heart support, but there was no double. Again the king of clubs was led to the ace and ruff. Song played ace and another spade and Chen discarded a losing club so Li won the king. He cashed a club winner then switched to diamonds and there were two of those plus a heart to be lost so the contract was once again down three. This time, however, the price was only -150 so Nanguang gained 8 IMPs.





East must not exactly have been charmed to see his partner make a two-suited overcall to show the minors after the shock of South's I♠ opening. Both Peng and Li gave preference to clubs and would have been very relieved not to be doubled – can North really not double 3♥ for penalties with such a strong diamond holding along with four decent trumps?

For Guangzhou, Wong led the jack of clubs to the queen and king and Chan returned a club to declarer's ten. Peng played the queen of spades, covered by the ace and ruffed, then a low diamond towards his jack. Chan went in with the queen and was awkwardly placed. He got out with the six of hearts, Wong winning the ace and returning the jack. Shen won in hand with the queen and played the king of diamonds to Chan's ace. Chan led a heart to dummy's king then ruffed Shen's play of the king of spades and found the winning play of his low diamond to Wong's nine. The play of the jack of spades now promoted the nine of clubs and the contract was down four for —400, leaving N/S wishing they had found a double.

Wang too led the jack of clubs to the queen and king but Chen switched to his spade to the king, ace and ruff. Song tried a low diamond from hand but Chen took the queen then returned a heart. Wang won the ace and returned his remaining club – five, seven, nine and ten. That was careless of Chen, who had thrown away his second club trick. Song crossed to hand with the queen of hearts and drew trumps then exited with a low diamond in hope that something good would happen. Chen won the ten and cashed the ace before exiting with a heart to dummy's king and Wang had the last trick with the jack of spades for down two; –200 but 5 IMPs to Guangzhou.

On Board 24 the Nanguang N/S pair were down one in a thin game when two finesses were unsuccessful; –50 while Guangzhou stopped in partscore for +170 so 6 IMPs to Guangzhou and the lead in the match at 11-8. Then came a deal with potential for a big swing.



For Nanguang, Chen opened a strong club then bid his hearts over the natural positive response. When Wang supported hearts, Chen cuebid then asked for key cards before jumping to the small slam. He won the diamond lead in dummy, drew trumps in two rounds and eventually took the spade finesse; 12 tricks and +980.

Chan opened a natural I♥ then rebid a game-forcing 3♦. When Wong gave heart preference, Chan showed his club control, also denying a top spade, and Wong took control with RKCB. Six clubs showed the club void as well as the three key cards, and Wong bid the grand slam, expecting that it would either be cold or requiring a spade finesse. Here the lead was a trump and, in grand slam, Chan wanted any extra chance he could find. He won in hand then led a second heart to dummy and ruffed a club. Back to dummy with another heart, he took a second club ruff and down came the ace. Doubleton ace with ten cards missing was not exactly a high percentage chance, but Chan had played for it and deserved his good fortune. That was +1510 and 11 IMPs to Gunagzhou, who led by 22-8.

Both Easts opened INT. Shen transferred then bid an artificial 2 before settling for 3NT when Peng bid his diamonds, while Song used a two-way Stayman sequence to show five hearts and invite game, Li choosing to play in 3NT. Both Souths led the king of spades and both declarers ducked.

Wong continued with a second spade honour, Peng winning and playing queen then ten of hearts to the king. He cashed out the hearts then led the jack of diamonds to the queen and ace, cashed the  $\Diamond$ K then led the ten of clubs to the jack, queen and ace. Chan could cash the second club but, having come down to ace-king doubleton, had then to give the last trick to declarer's  $\Diamond$ 8; nine tricks for +600.

Wang, knowing that he had no entry to the spades, switched at trick two. It is often better in these circumstances to continue to clear your long suit as this conceals from declarer the fact that you lack an entry to cash the established winners and he has to do all his own work. Here, the ten of diamonds switch made it easy for Li, who covered with the jack – queen, ace. Li returned a low diamond to the seven and nine and all Chen could do was to cash the top clubs; nine tricks for +600 and a flat board.

Both Wests began with their version of Stayman then showed the diamonds, and both Easts bid  $3^{\circ}$  to mark time and see what partner would do next rather than make a more committal bid.

All Pass

Shen clearly understood what was going on as he now bid 3NT with the West hand and that ended the auction. However, despite Wong's club lead going round to declarer's queen, there simply weren't enough tricks before the defence could get the clubs going. Peng won the club and led a diamond to dummy followed by the jack of hearts, but had to lose three clubs plus three aces for down two and –200.

Whatever the subtleties of the Guangzhou auction, something went wrong as Song seems to have bid on the assumption that his partner held a fifth hearts, while Li wanted to play in diamonds all along as he knew hearts would provide only a four-three fit. Eventually, the music stopped in 6♦, doubled by Wang, who knew both his aces must be standing up. Chen's third ace was just a bonus and meant that the slam had to go down two for −500 and 7 IMPs to Nanguang.

That all left Guangzhou Pearl River with a small win, by 26-19 IMPs, or 12.51-7.49 VPs, and kept them at the top of the Group C rankings. Nanguang Power, meanwhile, slipped to fifth position but were still very much in the hunt for a qualifying place.



#### Geely Auto v Haoran - Open Round 7

Round 7 featured another highly-fancied Chinese team, Geely Auto, who were up against the Chinese Taipei team, Haoran. The match began with a slam deal.

For Geely Auto, Yu Zhang opened a Precision  $2\clubsuit$  with the North cards and S.Y. Wang overcalled  $2\heartsuit$ . That must have been a rather pleasant surprise to his partner, who had a huge hand in support of hearts and quickly took control. Four Club showed heart support and club shortage but, with a weak hand for a two-level overcall, Wang signed off in game. Liu, however, asked for key cards then invited the grand, Wang signing off in  $6\heartsuit$ , where the friendly spade situation meant that he had all 13 tricks for +1010.

In the other room, Ying Li Lin, for Haoran, opened at the one level and Meng Kang too overcalled. Shaolin Sun too bid strongly with the West cards and finally jumped to the small slam; +1010 and no swing.



For Geely Auto, Sun opened a Precision I♣ and Lin overcalled I♥ — I'm not sure what that meant, given his partner's silence. Kang could bid a semi-positive 2♦ and Sun, seeing no likelihood of game, passed. Tzulin Wu tried a low spade through the strong hand so the bare king scored. Kang played a diamond, Wu winning the ace and returning a diamond to prevent a spade ruff in the dummy. From here Kang had to concede a club and two spades so had nine tricks for a safe +110.

Liu and Wang, for Haoran, had an uncontested auction to 3NT after a potentially short club opening and transfer response. Wang bid 3NT with no real spade stopper and found that he could not make it. Weiping Nie led a low spade to the bare king, Zhang encouraging strongly with the nine. Nie grabbed the ace on declarer's first diamond play and played ace and another spade so, with a diamond entry to hand, Wang had the rest after the spades had been cashed and escaped for down one and -100; 5 IMPs to Geely Auto.

Both Easts opened INT. Wu doubled to show a one-suiter then, when Sun's pre-emptive jump to  $3\Diamond$  came back to him, competed with  $3\heartsuit$ . Sun led the ten of diamonds to the ace and king and Kang switched to the jack of clubs. And that was the contract. Wu's bare king scored and he had to concede just two trumps and the ace of spades so had nine tricks for +140.

In the other room, Nie overcalled 2<sup>▽</sup> and Liu used Lebensohl. Nie repeated the hearts after Wang bid 3♣ as requested, and was left to play there. Here, the lead was a club. Wang rose with the ace and cashed the ◇A then continued with a second diamond to the king. When he won declarer's trump play with the ace he returned a spade to Liu's ace and that was one down for −50 and 5 IMPs back to Haoran.



Liu opened a short club and rebid I♥ over the transfer response to show a weak no trump type without four-card heart support. Wang had values for game and no reason to look elsewhere so jumped to 3NT. Nie led the three of diamonds to the eight and jack. Wang played a club and Nie rose with the ace and pushed a spade through, the queen losing to the king. Zhang switched to clubs but it no longer mattered. Wang cashed out for nine tricks and +400.

The Geely Auto auction in the other room was simplicity itself and it had the effect of putting the other defender on lead. Lin led a low spade, Sun putting up dummy's jack and, when it held the trick, leading a club. Wu played low so Sun won the queen and continued with a second club to the king and ace. He played the queen on the spade return so Lin won the king but, rather than continue with a third spade, switched to a club. That established two club tricks and, with declarer a trick short of his contract and in need of a diamond trick, that meant down one for –50 and 10 IMPs to Haoran.

Zhang did not open the North hand but showed her strength by redoubling at her next turn then introducing the long clubs. However, when Nie bid diamonds for a third time, Zhang chose to defend 3° rather than try an optimistic game bid. Right she was. Nie led the king of clubs, Wang winning the ace and returning a club. Zhang won and played the king of diamonds but Nie overtook to push a heart through. Zhang had the °K and a diamond to lead to her partner's queen and, with an unavoidable spade loser, Wang was down one for –50 and 4 IMPs to Geely Auto.

On the final deal, system permitted Liu/Wang to stop in an easy I $^{\circ}$ , making with an overtrick for +90, while Sun/Kang got to INT and were down two for -200. Those 7 IMPs boosted Haoran's margin of victory to 22-9 IMPs, or I4.28-5.72 VPs. After seven rounds, with six more matches to be played, Geely Auto topped the Group A rankings with Haoran close behind in second place.



#### Jilin Dingyuan v HK Vincent - Open Round 8

For Round 8 we take a look at the top of Group B, where Jilin Dingyuan of China topped the rankings, while Chine Hong Kong's HK Vincent lay third going into the match. What today looks more and more like a down the middle pre-empt, despite there being only six cards in the main suit, created some action on the first deal.

When his partner opened 34, Wentong He, for Jilin, took a stab at 3NT, however, when W.K. Lai doubled, he wisely removed to 44, which ended the auction. K. F. Mak led a trump, Chunhui Dong winning dummy's ace to lead a diamond to the queen followed by a second diamond to the eight and jack. Lai returned a heart, Dong winning the ace and playing the ten of diamonds, Lai covering with the ace. Dong ruffed and and gave up a spade. Mak won the king and returned a heart and had to lose one of those and a second spade so was down one for -50.

At the other table, Baron Ng did not bid 3NT, preferring to pass. Xu Jing, for Jilin, doubled for take-out then guessed to raise the 3♠ response to game. Ng led the ace of clubs, Tony Lau dropping the king, and switched to ace and another heart. Bin Shi won the second heart and led a spade to his king then a diamond to the jack and queen. He ruffed the club return in dummy and cashed the ace of spades, bringing down the queen. That was good news, but he needed a second club ruff and that simply could not be managed. Shi tried a heart from dummy but Lau could ruff and that was the fourth defensive trick; down one for -50 and 3 IMPs to HK.



For HK, Ng opened INT and was left to play there. Jing's low diamond lead went to the queen and king and Ng played a heart at trick two. Jing took the ace and rattled off five rounds of diamonds, which squeezed everyone to varying degrees. He then exited with the ten of hearts and, with declarer having come down to one heart in each hand, that established a trick for Shi's queen. Ng could take one black-suit finesse but not both and had to lose two tricks at the end for down two and -200.

For Jilin, He opened a strong club. I don't know what 2 meant but I imagine that it included more options than just a diamond suit, making Mak's 20 response pass or correct. When He doubled 20 for take-out, Dong had a maximum pass so jumped to 30, but He wasn't interested. Mak led the queen of diamonds to the king and ace and Lai continued with a second diamond to dummy's jack. He played a heart to the king then ruffed the third diamond before playing a second heart to Lai's ace. Lai got out with a club, Mak playing low so He won the jack and led a low spade to the queen and king. Mak cashed the Q then played a spade but He was in control. He won the ace and jack of spades, ruffed the fourth spade and led a club to the queen for nine tricks, +140 and 8 IMPs to Jilin.

Lai, for HK, was quite happy to open 3 despite holding a four-card heart suit on the side, but Jing was not so passed.

The 3♠ opening saw Mak raise to game and N/S were shut out of the auction completely. Dong cashed the ace of diamonds then switched to a club to dummy's ace. Lai ran the queen of spades now and Dong won the king and returned his heart to the king and ace. He gave his partner the heart ruff to defeat the contract by a trick; –50. Yes, Lai could have made his contract by playing ace and another spade, but that would have required a lucky heart position and surely the simple spade finesse was a far better shot.

Where Jing passed as dealer, Lau could open I♦ as South and Ng get his hearts into the game. Even now, Jing made only a simple I♠ overcall where many would be jumping to 2♠ or 3♠. That left room for Lau to show his second suit and also for Shi to show some spade support. Facing genuine diamond support, it isn't clear whether Lau bid on to the five level to make or as a sacrifice against 4♠ — quite likely he took a two-way shot in case either game was making. Shi led a spade against 5♦, Jing winning the ace and switching to his club to the king and ace. As in the other room, a HK game was defeated by a ruff; one down for — 50 and 3 IMPs to Jilin.






Lau opened the South hand with a strong no trump and Ng used Stayman. When Jing overcalled, Lau passed it round to Ng who doubled for take-out. Now Lau bid 2NT, not considering his hand to be worth game unless Ng could bid again, and that ended the auction. Shi dutifully led his heart so Jing won the queen and cashed a second heart, just in case. No, declarer really did have a heart stopper, so Jing switched to a spade. Lau won the ace and crossed to dummy with a club to lead a diamond to the jack. Shi ducked but Lau was not tempted to do anything silly. He continued with ace and a third diamond and had nine tricks for +150.

Dong opened with a strong club and Mak made an artificial overcall to show some sort of two-suited combination. He doubled to show values then showed the diamonds and, when Dong supported them, asked for a spade stopper, Dong duly bidding 3NT. Mak led the queen of spades, Dong winning the king as Lai signalled with the nine. Dong crossed to a top club and led a diamond to the jack them when that held, continued with two more rounds of diamonds. Mak won the  $\Diamond$ K and tried to beat the contract, leading a low spade. Alas, his partner did not have the holding he needed and that merely presented Dong with an overtrick in the shape of his  $\spadesuit$ 7; +630 and 10 IMPs to Jilin.

Board 18. Dealer East. N/S Vul.



Shi opened a strong no trump and Ng overcalled 3¢, which shut out Jing who could hardly commit to this level with 5 HCP and a ropy five-card spade suit. Jing led the eight of hearts in search of a ruff and that solved declarer's only problem — not that he would have got hearts wrong anyway on this auction. Ng scooped in the ten of hearts and played the queen of diamonds. Mak won that and cashed the  $\pm$ K then switched to a low club. Lai won and continued with a second club but that was it for the defence; nine tricks and +110.

In the other room, Mak had to open I♣ and He too overcalled 3♦. Mak felt that he had sufficient in hand for his opening bid that, with shortish diamonds, he could make a reopening double. That proved to be a success as he found Lai with a bit of distribution including a five-card spade suit. Lai won the diamond lead and cashed the ace of spades then exited with his remaining diamond. He played back the nine of clubs so Lai won the ace and ran the eight of spades, led a club to the king and cashed the king of spades then gave up a heart. Dong overtook his partner's nine and returned a second heart to the ace to get a diamond through. That promoted the ♣10 into a winner but that was the fourth and last trick for the defence and Lai was home with nine tricks for +140 and 6 IMPs to HK.

Board 19. Dealer South. E/W Vul.



He opened a weak no trump as North and Lai doubled. Everyone passed that with varying degrees of enthusiasm and Lai led the four of hearts to the ten and gueen. He ducked the heart and ducked again when Mak continued the suit. He had to win the third round, of course, and played ace and another diamond to Lai's king. Lai cashed the heart winner and that saw declarer pitch a spade from dummy and a club from hand. Lai could not afford to play a black card so exited with his last diamond to dummy. Now the fourth diamond squeezed him. While declarer came to ace-doubleton facing jack-to-three in each black suit, Lai had to come down to king-queen-doubleton in one or the other and, whichever suit he discarded from, He would play ace and another to set up his seventh trick. In practice, Lai discarded the ten of clubs and He placed ace and another club; +180.

If that looked to be a poor result for HK, it was nothing like as bad as the one they achieved in the other room. There Ng opened I and Jing overcalled INT with the East cards. Lau doubled and the HK pair found themselves in a forcing situation and a doubling rhythm. When their opponents scrambled their way into the four-four heart fit, 20 was doubled and, though it can be defeated double dummy, it was way too tight to be comfortable at IMP scoring. Lau led the jack of hearts, ducked to Jing's king. Jing returned the nine of hearts to the ten, queen and ace, and Ng exited with his last heart. Jing got off play with a low diamond to Lau's nine and Lau in turn got off with a second diamond to his partner's ace. Ng, however, had no red card with which to get off play so had to open up one of the black suits, either of which could cost a trick if declarer read the position correctly. He chose to lead a low club. Jing won the king and played the queen of spades. Lau won the ace and returned a diamond, but Jing could win the  $\Diamond K$ , play king of spades ruff a spade, and lead a club to the queen for his eighth trick; +670 and 13 IMPs to Jilin.

On the final deal Ng/Lau bid to a very optimistic 3NT which had to fail by a trick for −100 while He/Dong stopped safely in 3♣, which made with an overtrick for +130 and 6 IMPs to Jilin. That completed a convincing win for Jilin Dingyuan by 40-9 IMPs, converting to 18.00-2.00 VPs and keeping them at the head of the Group B rankings. HK Vincent, meanwhile, slumped to seventh position and had some work to do to get into a qualifying position.

#### **Dragonite v Bozetto - Open Round 9**

Just one deal from the Round 9 clash of Singapore's Bozetto and China Hong Kong's Dragonite, but it's a big one.

For Bozetto, Edwin Lau started the North hand with a good old-fashioned strong jump shift. I am not familiar with their methods so I don't know why Loke Leng Wong had to rebid 2NT rather than 3♥. He did repeat the hearts twice, but it seemed that the situation was not clear because when Lau bid 4NT Wong did not show two key cards plus the trump queen, so presumably hearts were not agreed from his point of view. Lau gave up at this point and simply jumped to 6NT, so also presumably he assumed the ♥Q to be missing. Anyway, the one thing of which we can be certain is that something went wrong. Maybe the North hand was too strong for a strong jump shift and the 2♠ response pre-empted their own auction?


Having suggested that perhaps the 2♠ bid took important space away from the N/S auction, see how it went when North, Leo Cheung, could bid a simple I♠ then follow up with a forcing 2♠ at his second turn. Chris Fung had room to bid hearts three times at the one-, two- and three-levels, and that was sufficient to convince Cheung that his bare king should be enough to run the suit – if Fung had the ♥Q. He checked on key cards and, on discovering two plus the trump queen, duly bid 7NT. When hearts were three-two, there were 13 top tricks, so well bid and worth 11 IMPs to the Dragonite cause for +1520 against +1020. They won the match by 47-12 IMPs, 18.58-1.42 VPs.


小组循环赛第8轮,A组,香港 Wizards 队 vs 甘肃桥协队。



开室双方的叫牌很稳健。3S 定约完成相对 轻松,庄家基本可以每个花色各输 1 墩。

甘肃桥协队南家李聪智的 3C 先发制人,导致对手叫高 1 阶。北家首攻拔掉 CA,换攻方块,明手摆小,南家 DQ 吃进并继续方块需求将吃。庄家 SA 调将并用 SJ 飞牌丢失给北家的双张 SQ, 北家拔掉 HA 并给同伴将吃方块。防守方共获得 1 墩将牌和 1 个将吃,其他花色各 1 墩。4S 定约宕 2。

如果庄家在调将的时候打对将牌结构,敲下来双张 SO,定约将可以完成。



虽然仅有 10 点,并且还有两个单张大牌, 甘肃桥协队杨林还是选择了开叫 1S, 西家 党宝吉的 3C 是对黑心的邀叫或更好。SK 位 置不利, 5S 无法完成。

闭室,面对东家的 3S 阻击叫,西家手持并非很有特色的牌直接加叫到局似乎并不被多数牌手接受,但结果也许并不坏,将对手抬到 5 阶定约。

东家首攻拔掉 SA,然后换出小红心-Q-K-A。 庄家此时如果简单调将,完成定约已非难 事。但庄家选择小红心桌上将吃,SK 垫掉 小草花,再出小草花到 J,东家 CQ 吃到。 后面由于草花恶劣分布,被东家单张 DK 超 将吃了。5D 宕一。

虽然东家有很多机会获得将吃草花的机会,但庄家自己去错失机会,帮助了对手而没能完成定约,还是很令人遗憾的。





南家首攻 DQ, 北家 DA 超过来并继续方块, 暗手 DK 吃进, 小红心-10-Q-A, 北家换出小黑心, 很可惜, 庄家摆错大牌位置上了 SQ, 防守方的赢墩一下子通畅了, 最终赢得 S3-H1-D3-C1 共 8 墩, 1NT 宕 2。

赛后闭室甘肃桥协队南北队员承认是两人对 XX 记忆产生了偏差,本该抓到大鱼的,不小心自己放走。好在 2D 最终完成了。

广州珠江队也面临了相同的境况,但抓住战机, W-2DX-2赢得500。

对手也出现错误。2D 本是方块加上面一套 4-4,东西方本该很容易找到4-4红心定约。





甘肃桥协队开室和闭室都是使用精确体系。 开室西家队员开叫了 1D,对手的叫牌是本 手,稳健的停在 2C 定约。

闭室,北家秦军开叫小无将,南家李聪智虽然点力仅有8点,但依仗6张草花套,感觉赢墩机会多,一跃到局。

东家首攻 SQ, 找到了南北的弱点, 击宕定约已不是问题。但庄家 SK 忍让了首攻, 却让东家陷入了长考......换攻小红心!!(可能是看到明手的草花套心虚, 想提前打掉明手HA 进手)。

暗手 HQ 吃进后,出 C9!! 东家机敏的扑上 CJ (如果跟 C8,庄家明手也跟小,定约回家了)。现在庄家的 CQ 锁在暗手,东家准确的放掉 CQ 不吃,明手的草花套已经魂断蓝桥。

按照现在的草花分布, 庄家红心手后出 CQ! 不管东家跟什么, 明手都跟小, 成功机会将很大。除非东家能够换攻出方块(由于南北红心已阻塞, 庄家只能吃到 H2-D1-C5 共 8墩), 否则都无法阻止庄家完成定约。
