

Open Final I – Geely Auto v Ambassador

China's Geely Auto had scraped through their semi-final against Jilin Dingyuan by just 8 IMPs, having picked up a game swing on Board 46 out of 48. Meanwhile, the multinational Ambassador had played a very tight match for two of the three sessions against SHNTBC but then destroyed their opponents in the third and final session to win by 70 IMPs. Geely Auto started the match with a 4 IMP carryover from the round robin stage.

All tournament it seems that the matches have started with swings on the early boards but, for once, we saw a quiet start with three flat boards. The E/W pairs handled this next one rather badly.

To arrive in 3NT with that combined club holding is disappointing, but one can at least sympathise with Sun and Kang, for Geely Auto, as Kelvin Ng's overcall showed the majors, and they had those well under control. Chiu and Sze, however, for Ambassador, had been warned about the club problem by Wang's double of Stayman. It might be difficult to go plus on the deal, with 50 a quite likely resting spot, but you really should be able to avoid 3NT now, perhaps by East cuebidding 3♣ to check for a stopper rather than jumping to 3NT (I am assuming that they do not play that any call other than pass over the double does not show a club stopper, as some pairs play).

Sheng Yue Gui had been asked to lead a club so that is what he did. Liping Wang won the ace and continued with the jack and that was the first seven tricks for the defense; -300.

Ng too led a club, the eight (presumably the correct systemic card as in Polish style), and Cheng Yen Lam won the ace then sat and thought. That eventually resulted in a switch to the queen of hearts, Shaolin Sun winning the ace and cashing all the diamonds. Ng came down to three spades, two hearts and the bare king of clubs, so Sun played three rounds of spades to Ng's queen and had to come to a heart trick and nine in all for +600 and 14 IMPs to Geely Auto.



For Ambassador, Lam opened a weak no trump and that went round to Meng Kang, who overcalled to show the majors. Sun showed preference for hearts and Ng doubled for take-out. That gave Lam a problem. He didn't feel comfortable passing and risking doubling his opponents into game, and chose to bid the three-card diamond suit.

Two Hearts would, of course, have been beaten by a couple of tricks on accurate defense, while 3♦ on the three-three fit was completely hopeless. Sun led the three of hearts to dummy's bare ace and Lam led a club to the king, ruffed a heart, played ace of clubs and ruffed one, then took a second heart ruff. He led a winning club but Kang ruffed in with the queen, forcing the ace. Sun threw his last heart on this trick so could ruff in front of dummy on Kang's next heart play, cash the ♦K and claim the rest. The contract was down two for –100.

That was hardly a triumph for N/S, but it proved to be good enough for a winning board. In the other room, Wang opened I♦ and the spade fit was found. When Gui jumped to 4♠, Sze knew what to do to that. Sze led the queen of diamonds to dummy's ace and Gui played king of clubs, a club to the jack then the ace of clubs pitching a diamond. Gui continued with a fourth club and Sze ruffed with the ♠4, Gui discarding the last diamond from dummy. Sze played ace, king and eight of spades to dummy's nine and Gui could only come to three more tricks so was down two for –300 and 5 IMPs to Ambassador; 5-20. Both E/W pairs handled this next one well.



Gui opened a multi $2\lozenge$ and Wang's $3\clubsuit$ response implied better hearts than spades. With such solid spades, Gui went on to game. With hearts shown on his left, Sze's decision to show his two-suiter was a brave one and resulted in the excellent diamond game being reached. Ng opened a level higher and Kang doubled for take-out then bid $4\heartsuit$ over the $4\clubsuit$ response. When that attracted a double from Lam, Kang ran to $5\diamondsuit$ and must have been well pleased with the dummy.

There was a club and a heart to be lost but no problems in the play so both made II tricks for a push board at +600.



Lam/Ng had an unrevealing and very aggressive auction to the spade game, against which Sun led a very helpful nine of hearts to the queen and ace. Lam played a low spade so Sun won the king and led a second heart, picking up his partner's jack — maybe East's falsecard at trick one, which made his partner think he had the VKQ instead of VQJ, was not such a clever move, though declarer was always going to pick up the hearts after the opening lead. Lam cashed the A and led his diamond and Sun still did not know sufficient about the hand to know what to do. When he played low dummy's king scored and Lam had no

diamond loser. Just one more thing required, a friendly club position. Lam returned to hand with a heart to his ten and led a club up and this time Sun did take his ace. There was the ΦQ to be lost but Lam had ten tricks for +620 and prospects for a major swing to Ambassador.

At the other table, Abby Chiu overcalled 24 and Gui raised to 24. Now Wang made a game try and Gui made what I consider to be a horrible bid. If partner wanted 3NT to be an option, he could have cuebid 34 rather than bid 30. The latter asks North to look at his heart holding to help decide whether to bid 3♠ or 4♠, With nearly all North's modest values in partner's short suits, he should sign off in 34. Wang knew 3NT could not be right so bid out his shape and Gui put him back to 44. There was no danger of the contract being allowed to make at this table, where Chiu started with the ace of diamonds then switched to ace and another club. Wang won the ♣K and led a heart, Sze splitting is honours. Wang won the VK and played ace and another spade. Now Chiu got out with a diamond and that gave declarer the second dummy entry he required to pick up the hearts - had Chiu instead led a club, declarer would have ruffed then played a spade and East would have had only red cards to lead so it would have come to the same thing. Wang was one down for -100 and 12 IMPs to Ambassador; 17-23.

Sze opened with a strong no trump and Chiu transferred to hearts. Gui doubled to show his diamonds and Sze broke the transfer to show his excellent heart support. When Wang competed with 3♦, Chiu left it to his partner and, when Sze in turn competed with 3♥, raised him to game – a good call to make with only one queen but five-five distribution. Wang led a diamond. Gui won and switched to the queen of clubs so Sze won, drew trumps and knocked out the ♣K; ten tricks for +420.

Kang opened with a strong club and Sun made a negative response. This allowed Ng to make a 2♦ overcall and that was passed around to Sun who competed with 2♥. Ng had enough to spare for a take-out double and that made it possible for Lam to bid 4♠ over Kang's raise to 4♥. Sun led his singleton diamond. Lam won the ace and played a spade. Kang won the ace, cashed the ♥K, ♣A and ♥A, then gave his partner a diamond ruff for down two. That was — 100 but 8 IMPs to Ambassador, who had the lead for the first time at 25-23.

By different routes, both N/S pairs reached the normal contract of 3NT, but those different routes led to the contract being played from different sides of the table.

Where Lam played the hand as South he received the lead of the queen of hearts round to his king. He led a diamond to the eight and jack and back came the eight of hearts for the nine and jack. Sun switched to a club, Lam winning dummy's ace and cashing the diamonds and, when they proved to be three-three, simply cashed his top winners for nine painless tricks; +600.

The contract was considerably more challenging for Gui, who had to play it as North on a low heart lead/ He put in the nine and lost to the jack. Back came the seven of clubs so Gui rose with the ace and led a spade ducking Sze's jack. Sze led another low heart and Gui called for the ten, losing to the queen. With no heart trick, Gui was under pressure now. Chiu returned another club so Gui won the king, crossed to the ace of spades and made the key play of a club to his ten. When that held the trick he could cash out nine tricks to flatten the board at +600. Well done to Gui, who had had a much tougher time than declarer in the other room.

Set One ended with Ambassador ahead by a single IMP at 25-24. It looked as though we were in for the really tight match we had hoped for.

Ambasaador v Geely Auto - Open Final 2

Ambassador led by a single IMP, 25-24, at the end of the first session of the Open final. After two flat boards, Geely took the lead when both N/Ss played poor partscore contracts but they had the merit of making while Ambassador's did not; 5 IMPs to Geely. Both N/Ss bid smoothly to the top spot on the next deal.

For Ambassador, Sze made a pre-emptive heart raise but this was not sufficient to silence Nie, who introduced his long diamonds. Nie co-operated when Zhang tried for slam but then accepted his partner's decision to play the diamond game.

For Geely, Kang transferred to clubs rather than raise hearts. Lam made an invitational jump in diamonds and Ng splintered in support but the heart wastage meant that Lam signed off quickly.

There was nothing to the play with both declarers conceding the top trumps but having the rest; flat at +600.

Both Souths made different varieties of Bergen raise and West overcalled in hearts. Zhang bid only 3♠ now but Nie went on to game anyway over Sze's 47 and Zhang was left to play the spade game. Ng jumped to 44 over the intervention and Kang was bullied into showing his heart support at the five level, doubled by Ng.

Ng cashed the top spades against 5% doubled then switched to a club, Sun winning dummy's ace and playing a trump to the queen, king and ace. He ruffed the club return, cashed the % and had only to concede a second heart trick; down two for -300.

Sze led a heart against 4♠ – queen, king, ace. Zhang ruffed a heart, came to hand with a trump, ruffed her last heart and drew trumps. Next she led a club and Sze took the ace and returned a low diamond. Zhang ruffed the third diamond and led a club to the ten; ten tricks for +620 and 8 IMPs to Geely, leading by 37-25.

When his partner opened with a $3\clubsuit$ pre-empt, Sun was unsure who could make what and decided to lay claim to ownership of the deal for his side by responding with a forcing $3\diamondsuit$. When Ng now overcalled $4\heartsuit$, Sun followed through with $5\clubsuit$ and neither North nor South appreciated that the deal actually belonged to them and they needed to double. Lam led the jack of hearts against $5\clubsuit$, Ng overtaking and playing two more rounds. Kang ruffed, drew trumps and played on diamonds so had no spade loser and escaped for down one and -100.

Chiu made the more straightforward raise to 4♣ then allowed Zhang to play 4♥. Sze cashed the ace of clubs then switched to a spade, Chiu ducking dummy's nine. Zhang drew trumps and gave up a spade and a diamond; ten tricks for +420 and another 8 IMPs to Geely, up now by 45-25. The set had not started well for Ambassador, and it got

Kang led the four of spades to the ten and ace and Ng tried a heart to the jack. That lost to the queen and Sun played queen and another spade, Kang winning and cashing the thirteenth spade as dummy and West threw a diamond, declarer a club. Kang got off play with the ten of hearts, Ng winning in hand with the king and leading a club to the ace followed by the ♣J to queen and king. He cashed the ten of clubs, crossed to the ace of hearts and cashed the fourth club. However, nothing good happened in the ending so he had only eight tricks for down one and −100.

Sze too led the four of spades to the ten and ace but Zhang played on clubs, leading low to the ace then back to the queen and king. She cashed the remaining clubs and Chiu pitched a heart and a diamond from the West hand. Now three rounds of hearts set up the fourth heart and, after the defense had cashed the spades, Zhang had the rest; nine tricks for +600 and 12 more IMPs to Geely, who led by 57-25.

An overtrick IMP saw Geely Auto lead by 58-25 at the midpoint in the set and the match, and Ambassador were yet to score in the second set.

Zhang opened a strong club then showed her suit over the balanced positive response but, when Nie raised to 3\(\Delta\), made no effort to find slam as she had a minimum opening. At the other table a natural 1\(\Delta\) opening too saw North at the helm in the spade game.

Sze led the jack of hearts. Zhang won the king and drew trumps then took the diamond finesse. That lost and a heart came back so she won the ace and cashed a fourth spade and Sze discarded a heart so Zhang could cash both her hearts, cross to the \Diamond A and try a club to the king. That lost but she had ten tricks for +420.

Kang led the six of diamonds. Ng put in the queen, losing to the king, and Sun switched to the seven of hearts. Ng won the ace and drew trumps then cashed the king and queen of hearts and led a diamond to the ace followed by a low diamond. When Sun played the ten, Ng discarded his remaining heart and Sun, down to nothing but clubs, was forced to lead that suit. Ng got it right — of course he would, as he would never have followed this line if he intended to play for the ♣A to be on his right, and when his small card forced Kang's ace he had ten tricks for +620 and a flat board. But if the play record is correct, why could not Kang have overtaken with the jack of diamonds and played the ♥J? Ng would have to ruff and then lead a club from hand, losing two club tricks and the contract.

The teams exchanged moderate swings then at last came some good news for Ambassador.


Both Souths declared 4♠ and West was in lead with no attractive option open to him. Sun chose a trump, which solved declarer's problem in that suit. Lam ran the spade to Kang's king and Kang switched to a heart in response to his partner's overcall. Sun won the ace and returned a heart. Lam now drew trumps then made the key play of a low club to the jack, after which he had ten easy tricks for +620.

All Pass

In the other room, Chiu solved a different problem for declarer, leading a low club. Nie won dummy's jack and played the jack of hearts. Chiu won the ace and played ace and another diamond, and it was all about the trump suit. After some thought, Nie ran the queen of spades and had two losers there for down one, -100 and 12 badly-needed IMPs to Ambassador. They closed to 40-65.

Geely picked up 3 IMPs on Board 30 when their E/W pair were down one in 3NT while Ambassador played a completely hopeless 5\(\frac{1}{2}\)-3. The set ended with a slam deal.

Sun did not see a vulnerable weak two bid in the West cards so passed. Lam's I♠ response to the two-plus card I♠ opening was a transfer and 2♠ set up a game-force. With a very powerful hand, Ng was unwilling to settle for 3NT so moved on with 4♠, a clear slam try. After an exchange of cuebids Lam signed off in 6♠. Kang led his singleton heart round to the ten and queen. Ng cashed the ace of clubs then played a spade to the ace, pitched his small heart on the ace of diamonds, then played a spade to the king and ruffed a spade. A diamond ruff put him back in hand to ruff the last spade and now he erred by attempting to come back to hand with a heart rather than a diamond. It was only for the overtrick, of course, and when the ♡A was ruffed Ng had to settle for 12 tricks for +1370.

Chiu did open the West hand with a weak two bid. Zhang doubled and followed up with 3NT over the value-showing 3\(\times\) response. The apparent misfit somewhat dampened Zhang's enthusiasm, of course. She won the heart lead and cashed the clubs and when nobody made any mistake in their discarding had 11 tricks for +460 but 11 IMPs to Ambassador. The set closed with Geely Auto ahead by 70-50. There was one 16-board set to go.

Ambassador v Geely Auto - Open Final 3

With 16 deals to play China's Geely Auto led the multinational Ambassador squad by 70-50 IMPs, a useful but by no means decisive margin. Ambassador would want to start the set well.



Kang, for Geely, opened a strong club and Chiu made a weak jump overcall. Gui doubled to show values then bid no trump to show the heart stopper and was raised to game. Sze led his heart, dummy's queen holding the trick, and Gui played on spades. Chiu won and returned the queen of clubs to pin dummy's bare jack. Gui ducked but

won the club continuation and cashed all the spades then the hearts, ending in hand. Sze found himself squeezed between the -K and his diamond stopper and Gui therefore came to an eleventh trick for +460.

Ng opened a natural I♠ and Zhang made a two-suited overcall, hearts and a minor. When Lam made a weakish spade raise, Wang bid 44, pass or correct and so showing support for whichever minor his partner held. Though he suits were not good, Zhang did have an eleventh card between the two suits and so bid 5♣ over 4♠, promptly doubled by Lam. Ng led the king of spades to dummy's ace and Wang found the good play of a low heart away from the king. Lam looked at that for a bit then rose with the ace. He returned the nine of diamonds to the jack, king and eight, and Ng switched to spades, ruffed by Wang, who thought for a long time before playing king of hearts and ruffing a heart with the ten . Wang led a club to the queen and ace, ruffed the spade return and played winning hearts through Lam to negate the power of the \$8. There was no second trump loser now so Wang was down just one for -100 and 8 IMPs to Geely, stretching the lead to 78-50.





Chiu opened $I\heartsuit$ and Sze cuebid to show a constructive raise over Gui's overcall. Kang bid $4\diamondsuit$ to invite his partner to save if he wished to do so, but Gui had quite good defensive values so chose to pass out $4\heartsuit$. Chiu had no reason to get the hearts wrong so just lost a spade and a diamond; +650.

Zhang opened a strong club and Lam made a weakish jump overcall. When Wang showed a spade positive, Ng blasted 50, which Zhang doubled. There was nothing to the play, with Lam losing the five unavoidable top tricks for –500 but 4 IMPs to Ambassador; 54-78.



Zhang opened I♥ then, after getting heart preference from Wang, tried for game with 3♣, safe in the knowledge that she had limited her hand by not opening a strong club. Wang was aware of that, of course, but had the extra values required to take a stab at game and chose 3NT as most of his strength was in partner's short suit. Ng led a low spade so the ten scored. Wang led a heart to the king, ducked, and a low heart to the now bare ace. Lam found the diamond switch which meant that Wang had no time to go after an overtrick, but he had nine on top by now and took them for +400.

Sze showed an invitational three-card heart raise by responding with a forcing no trump then jumping to 3% and Chiu went on to game Gui led ace and another heart, Chiu unblocking the jack under the ace and next winning the nine. A low spade was ruffed and a club led to the queen. Chiu pitched two diamonds on the top spades then played a club to the jack and ace followed by the ten of clubs to Gui's king. Chiu could not be prevented from ruffing the fourth club in dummy and had ten tricks for +420 and an IMP to Ambassador; 55-78.

Ambassador picked up 2 more IMPs on Board 5 for an extra undertrick in a spade partscore and another for an overtrick in 4♠ on Board 6, so we were back to the situation at the start of the session, with Geely up by 20; 78-58. Geely got 2 IMPs back on Board 7 when Ambassador made +140 in 3♠ by E/W but lost -200 in 4♥ by N/S.

Gui and Kang had a well-controlled auction to 3NT, against which Sze led the king of clubs and, when that held the trick, continued with the ♣Q. That was also ducked so now Sze tried a heart. Gui won the ace and led a spade to the queen, a diamond to the king, and the next came came the king of spades, yet again ducked. Gui continued with the jack of spades, hoping to drop the ten, but Chiu won the ace and the ten did not appear. Chiu played back the ♥Q so Gui won the king and tried to split first the diamonds then the clubs. When neither suit proved to be three-three, he was a trick short; down one for −100.

I'm not sure how to describe the Lam/Ng auction, but probably not well-controlled. Ng won the club lead and played the queen of spades. Zhang won the ace and led a club to her partner's queen and Wang switched to a heart. Ng won, ruffed a spade and tried to split the trumps. When diamonds proved to be five-one, the contract fell apart and was down three for –300 and 5 IMPs to Geely; 85-58.

Board 10 was flat in 3.4+1 by E/W and Board 11 saw Wang bring in a couple of overtricks in 3NT that were not made at the other table for 2 IMPs to Geely, 87-58.

Gui/Kang had a strong club auction to 4%. As we have seen on several occasions over the last few days, Lam and Ng play a highly complex system and I don't intend to try to guess exactly what was going on. What we can see is that they too settled in the heart game.

The contract was very quickly defeated when Chiu led the ace of spades followed by the ace of clubs and there were two unavoidable trump losers to come; down one for -50.

Zhang led a low club at the other table, clearly not knowing exactly what to expect for the artificial auction of her opponents. The *Q lost to the king and Ng returned the *J for the king and ace. Next he played the three top diamonds, ditching spades form hand. The third round was ruffed but, fortunately, by the long trump hand. Zhang played ace and another spade to dummy's queen and away went the small club from hand. Ace and another heart now held Ng's trump losers to one and he had ten tricks for +420 and 10 IMPs to Ambassador. They closed to 68-87 with four boards to play. Was there any hope for a famous comeback?

The answer to that question proved to be, no. the teams were to exchange swings over the remaining deals but Ambassador never got close enough to seriously worry their opponents. Geely Auto of China had won the 2017 Hong Kong Intercity Championship, defeating Ambassador in the final by 95-79 IMPs. Congratulations to Sheng Yue Gui, Wei Ping Nie, Meng Kang, Shao Lin Sun, Li Ping Wang and Yu Zhang.
